

Transfer Station News & Notes

Tipping Fees to Increase by 1.75% as of January 1, 2014 - Please be advised that starting on January 1, 2014, the tipping fees charged for the disposal of solid waste types at the MCMUA transfer stations will be increased by 1.75% or \$1.64/ton. The 2013 tipping fee of \$93.92/ton for the disposal of all waste types will be increased to \$95.56/ton. See the tipping fee chart below for details.

Recycling is Mandatory for Specific Materials

Morris County has designated specific materials to be source separated and recycled. This mandate applies to <u>all</u> Morris County waste generators including residents, businesses, schools, institutions, construction sites, etc. A listing of these mandated recyclable materials is provided in the sidebar on the right, but please note that this listing is a generalized listing. Specific definitions of these materials and any exceptions that may apply are available on the MCMUA website at <u>http://mcmua.com/</u>.

Please realize that Morris County's source separation recycling mandate is nothing new, as these materials have been mandated to be recycled since 1993. Disposing of designated recyclable materials in the trash is not acceptable and is illegal in Morris County. The MCMUA has been advised that the Morris County Office of Health Management will be inspecting loads and issuing fines for disposing of designated recyclables at the transfer stations.

Materials Mandated to be Source Separated and Recycled

- Aluminum Cans
- Glass Bottles and Jars
- Plastic Bottles (coded 1 and 2)
- Steel (Tin) Cans
- Newspaper
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Mixed Paper
- Leaves
- Grass Clippings
- Brush

- Oil-Contaminated Soil
- Used Motor Oil
- Lead-Acid Batteries
- Hazardous Dry Cell Batteries
- Metal Appliances

Fill In the Correct Waste Origin (Town) on the Origin and **Destination (O&D) Form -** The MCMUA requests that when you complete your O&D form, you take care in completing the section regarding the waste origin, which is the town where the garbage was generated. Many towns share similar names such as Morristown, Morris Township and Morris Plains; Boonton and Boonton Township; Chatham Borough and Chatham Township; and Rockaway Borough and Rockaway Township. The MCMUA requests that you accurately designate your load as being from the correct municipality. In addition, if your load is from multiple origins you should specify all the towns in the load by an estimated percentage as provided on the O&D form. Finally, please realize that many towns share zip codes, so you cannot use the zip code of the generator to determine the waste origin. You must consider and know where the actual town boundaries are. As an example, many Morris Township, addresses use the 07960 Morristown zip code so, please know where the municipal boundaries are and the location of your customers and fill out the O&D form correctly.
